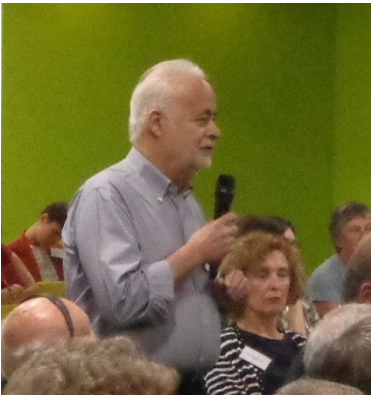

An opportunity to share good practices and facilitation of exchanges in all aspects of life, trade, culture, learning, travel for example

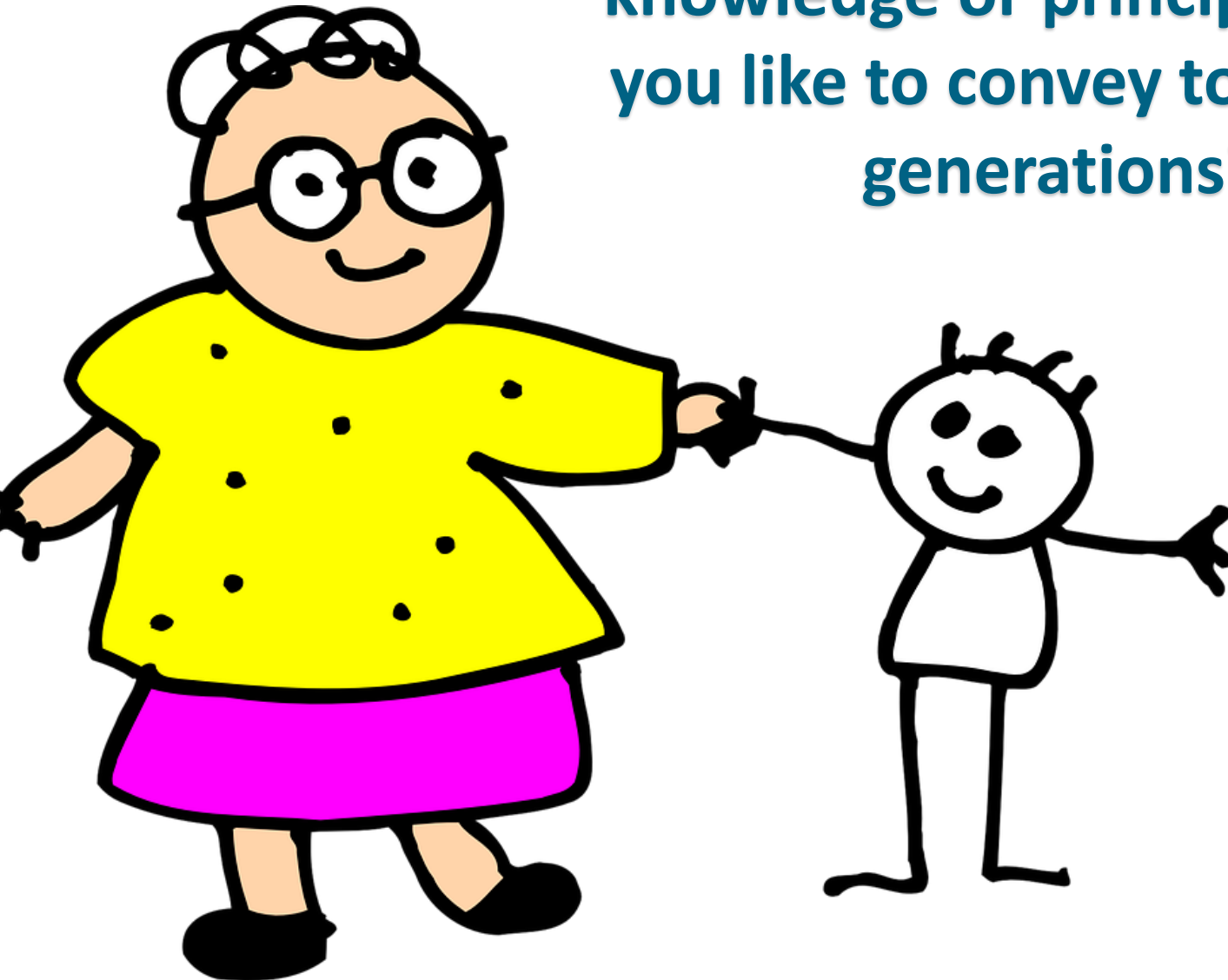

Staying together and helping each other makes us stronger and gives a chance of growing stronger

A value to convey to younger and future generations is the democratic way of solving problems between countries and seeking the way to build a common future, not despite the different cultures, but within those differences

Although we have our tradition, knowledge or principles, which we must proudly keep, there are many such aspects in other member states which we must admire and enjoy in a friendly manner

Respect of human beings at all ages – men and women equally – freedom of thinking and religion, respect of democracy, constitutions and laws. Recognition of work as a value

Many positive developments have been brought in Europe: more freedom, fraternity, equality. And respect for each particular culture

Keeping promoting culture, knowledge, human rights experience of other countries, freedom, dignity

An end to internal European wars. A belief and respect for democracy, a secular world, and aim for greater equality and justice for all

In an unjust economic system, where the dominion of finance has widened the gap between rich and poor, the principles and cultural values to be handed down are mainly those of solidarity between people and between generations, equality and equity based on work, education, the use of common goods, access to the benefits of the welfare state, eco-sustainability



What do you think should be improved to build a stronger and sustainable Europe?

More equal opportunities should be made available whatever the size of the member state

The anthroposophical and humanistic values are being overtaken by the financial prosperity. The markets tend to prevail over the people. A shift in creating a more human-based approach is needed

It is no use making laws if they are not enforced. It costs money but in the long run, if not immediately, making sure that enacted laws are not broken will turn out to be an "investment" in the daily well being of the population

Moving towards an inclusive society seeking social, economic, gender and ethnic equality, a common objective "to face the challenge of an ageing population by taking advantage of the new silver economy"

I think the unity in diversity should be improved. All of us are similar but with multiple identity, national identity. Europe should be inclusive in terms of economy, social and political policies

More democracy. An end to austerity. A clear belief in the separation of power between the law, the government, Parliament, the media and an economy and society for all ages, ethnicities, several identity, gender and social economic classes. More respect for diversity

European should to keep, support national traditions

The decision making process should bring countries closer to each other and give a real priority to countries inside the Union

The EU should be more focused on cultural aspects and less on financial issues

Sort out the euro – and the role of the European banks. Support the human rights and internationalization of the European Union

Confidence. Better media coverage. Better democracy

We have a common background but also differences due to history. Better understanding of the differences is needed to be able to use them as complementary background and build on better cooperation. Exchange more practices than theories in order to go faster to build common concrete projects
